Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF): Objectives

- * Foster excellence through the implementation of a research project;
- Enhance the creative and innovative potential of researchers holding a PhD (training on transferable skills & career development);
- Focus on i3 (international, inter-sectoral, interdisciplinary) mobility;
- Bridges with and exposure to the non-academic sector.

Call planning

Call Opening: 12 May 2022

Call Deadline: 14 September 2022

Evaluation period: October 2022 – January 2023

Launch Grant preparation: **February 2023**

Project Starting dates: March 2023 - September 2024



Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF): Types of Action

PF is a <u>mono-beneficiary</u> action to support post-doctoral research and careers and has the following options:

- **European Postdoctoral Fellowships** coming to Europe from any country in the world or moving within Europe;
- Global Postdoctoral Fellowships outside EU Member States and Horizon Europe AC.



Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF): Participation

Participating organisations*

Legal entity in an EU Member State or HE Associated country

Researchers:

- in possession of PhD at the call deadline (successful defense before call deadline);
- up to 8 years research experience after PhD (exceptions: career breaks, work outside research, research outside Europe for reintegrating researchers,...)
- Nationality:
 - **EFs:** any nationality
 - GFs: nationals or long-term residents of MS or HE AC *;
- Mobility rule: not resided/had main activity in the country of
 - **EFs** the beneficiary
 - GFs host organisation for more than 12 months in the 36 months before call deadline

Researcher: nationals or long-term residents of an EU Member State or a Euratom AC



^{*} Organisation: legal entity established inSpecific eligibility criteria for PFs supported by Euratom:
an EU Member State or Euratom AC

Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF): Conditions

Duration

• **EFs:** 12-24 months;

GFs: 24-36 months (12-24 outgoing phase + 12 months mandatory return)

Secondments (non compulsory) Worldwide

- EFs: not more than 1/3 of total of project
- **GFs** not more than 1/3 of total of outgoing phase + a max 3 months at beginning of the project at the beneficiary (to be deducted from the outgoing phase) **Note:** encoded in Part A (Call specific questions)

Non academic placement (NAP) (non compulsory) EU MS or HE AC

Additional period of max 6 months after project completion
 Note: encoded in part A as participant organisation + letter of commitment



ERA Fellowships (widening activities)

- No separate application or evaluation integral part of the MSCA Postdoctoral Fellowships call application form;
- For specific countries* available in Work Programme;
- Must be submitted by a host institution from a 'Widening' country;
- Only for EFs, GFs don't qualify;
- Only proposals scoring over 70% in the PF call will be considered and failed to reach an adequate place in the ranking to be funded under that call;
- Timing aligned with PF call.

NOTE: "call specific question" to be completed in the PF submission for EF to indicate willingness to participate in this call (only if host organisation is a qualifying country)

Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czechia, Estonia, Greece, Hungary, Latvia, Lithuania, Malta, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovakia, Slovenia and all
Associated Countries with equivalent characteristics in terms of R&I performance (Albania, Bosnia & Herzegovina, Kosovo 2, Montenegro, North
Macedonia, Serbia, Turkey, Armenia, Georgia, Moldova, Morocco, Tunisia, Ukraine, Faroe Islands) and the
Outermost Regions (defined in Art. 349 TFEU). Guadeloupe, French Guyana, Réunion, Martinique, Mayotte and Saint Martin (France)

Postdoctoral Fellowships (PF) 2022 Call Novelties

Resubmissions

Proposals, with same host organisation (and for GFs also the same associated partner hosting the outgoing phase) and the same researcher, submitted to the PF 2021 call and having received a score of less than 70% must not be resubmitted.

Non-academic placements

If the placement does not meet the requirements (missing letter of commitment or taking place in an academic organisation or in a Third Country), the proposal will be evaluated without taking into account the non-academic placement. This might affect the final score.

Secondments vs NAPs

Better guidance and instructions on how to properly encode this information to be found in the submission forms








All calls are published on the **Funding and Tenders Portal**

Proposal Submission-Part B

Part B-1

- strictly restricted to 10 pages;
- a cover page, table of contents, ...on page 1, 2, **will** count towards the page limit and automatically result in excess pages that cannot be evaluated;
- the Part B-1 should start with "1. Excellence" (instructions, definitions to be deleted before submission).

Part B-2

- no page restriction;
- Participating organisations (max 1 page for beneficiary, max ½ page others);
- Researcher's CV;
- Letters of commitment (host for outgoing phase of GF or non-academic placement host)
- Ethics & Security (additional info, if needed)



Do's and Dont's

FORMAT

- Read very carefully all available material and follow it closely;
- * Check carefully eligibility;
- Stick to the format requested (font size and page numbers);
- Make sure the layout is clear and not too busy/confused

CONTENT

- Think about the objectives of the MSCA;
- Make sure you cover all aspects as outlined and in a clear way;
- Have in mind the evaluation criteria;
- A clear Gantt Chart is essencial;
- Good and clear letters of commitment are important.
